The Board of Supervisors met at 9:00 o'clock A.M. with Eric Skoog, Chairman presiding. All members were present.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The Board approved the termination of Derek Meyer, in the Secondary Roads Department.

The Board approved the following Underground Utility Permits:

No. 18-01 – Kelly Garrett – installation of an 8” irrigation line and electrical cable bored under N Ave. between Kenwood Road and 170<sup>th</sup> Street. Ulmer abstained from voting.

No. 18-02 – Harrison County Rural Electric – installation of an electrical cable bored under Co Rd. E59 (a.k.a. U Ave.) at 2240 U Ave.

A motion was made by Schultz, seconded by Muhlbauer to approve the purchase of CAT 950K Wheel Loader from Ziegler in the amount of \$239,850.

Motion was passed unanimously.

A motion was made by Blum, seconded by Ulmer to approve the following resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. 2018-8

STOP AT INTERSECTION PER MUTCD 2B-5

WHEREAS: the Board of Supervisors is empowered under authority of Section 321.236 and 321.255 of the current Code of Iowa to designate any highway under their jurisdiction as a through highway, and to designate any intersection as a STOP intersection or YIELD intersection and to erect STOP signs or YIELD signs at one or more entrances such intersection, and

WHEREAS: West bound traffic at the intersection of Area Service Roads 180<sup>th</sup> St. and C Ave. is endangered by traffic from the North and South on 180<sup>th</sup> St. because of terrain, which limits sight distance,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Crawford County Board of Supervisors that the secondary road approach from the East on C Ave. be designated as “STOP approach” to the above described intersection and that a STOP sign shall be erected accordingly to cause traffic from the East on C Ave. to stop for oncoming traffic on 180<sup>th</sup> St. All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with the provisions of this resolution are hereby repealed.

Voting Aye: Blum, Muhlbauer, Schultz, Skoog and Ulmer. Voting Nay: None. Motion passed.

A motion was made by Ulmer, seconded by Muhlbauer to Proclaim April as Child Abuse Prevention Month in Crawford County.

Motion was passed unanimously.

A motion was made by Muhlbauer, seconded by Schultz to approve the CareerLink with Midwest Industries Sub-Recipient Agreement.

Voting Aye: Muhlbauer, Schultz, Skoog and Ulmer. Voting Nay: Blum. Motion passed.

A motion was made by Ulmer, seconded by Schultz to approve the CareerLink Monogram – Final Draw for \$9,081.00.

Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by Ulmer, seconded by Blum to Amend the Zoning Ordinance per recommendation of the Crawford County Zoning Board for GCC Alliance Concrete for a 5.00 acre parcel located in the NW corner of the NW1/4 SE1/4 NE1/4 of Section 22, T83N R39W from A-1 Agriculture to M-2 Industrial, contingent on the ownership changing to GCC Alliance Concrete.

Voting Aye: Blum, Muhlbauer, Schultz, Skoog and Ulmer. Voting Nay: None. Motion passed.

The Board approved the Sheriff's Quarterly Report for January - March 2018.
