The Board of Supervisors met at 9:00 o'clock A.M. with Jeri Vogt, Chairperson presiding. All members were present.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The Board met with Dawn Mentzer, Rolling Hills Community Services Region for a Rolling Hills Regional Update.

At 10:00 o'clock A.M., as scheduled, a motion was made by Schultz, seconded by Heiden to open the public hearing regarding reclassifying certain Secondary Roads from Area Service "B" to Area Service "A", L Ave. between US Hwy 59 and 2475 L

Ave. Motion was passed unanimously. There were no written or oral objections. At 10:04 o'clock A.M. a motion was made by Schultz, seconded by Rosburg to close the public hearing. Motion was passed unanimously.

A motion was made by Rosburg, seconded by Heiden to approve the following resolution:

Resolution 2021-43

Reclassifying certain Secondary Road from Area Service B Road to Area Service A Road.

WHEREAS, Crawford county desires to reclassify a certain road on the secondary road system in the county to provide for an increased level of maintenance; and

WHEREAS, Crawford County, after consultation with the Crawford County Engineer, has the authority to reclassify certain roads within the County as Area Service "A" roads pursuant to Iowa Code Section 309.57; and

WHEREAS, the Crawford County Board of Supervisors, after consulting with the Crawford County Engineer, desire to reclassify a certain road in Crawford County from Area Service "B" Road to Area Service "A" Road to provide for an increased level of maintenance in order to best utilize maintenance funds, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Notice of Public Hearing duly published according to the Iowa Code, Public Hearing as held on October 19, 2021 at 10:00 a.m. in the Board of Supervisors room at the Crawford County Courthouse, Denison, Iowa, to hear support and/or objections from the public on road so designated.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF CRAWFORD COUNTY that this County does hereby reclassify the road described as Area Service "A" road.

GOODRICH TOWNSHIP T-84N R-39W

L Ave between US Hwy 59 and 5475 L Ave. Said road generally lying in the Northeast Quarter Sec 32-84-39 and along the North Line of Sec 33-84-39.

Resolution Establishing a 28E Agreement with Iowa Department of Natural Resources

WHEREAS, Crawford County and Iowa Department of Natural Resources desire to continue the relationship between the county and the non-profit pursuant to an Iowa Code Chapter 28E agreement;

WHERAS, Crawford County and the Iowa Department of Natural Resources will cooperate with regards to permit-issuing authority with respect to private water well construction and reconstruction;

NOW THERFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CRAWFORD COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS that he Agreement known as the "Iowa DNR Agreement ID 21ESDWQBEDAY0001 Intergovernmental (28E) Agreement between the Iowa Department of Natural Resources and Crawford county, Iowa, a copy of which is attached.

RESOLUTION APPROVING IOWA CODE CHAPTER 28E COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF

DENISON AND CRAWFORD COUNTY FOR THE COLLECTION OF DELINQUENT PARKING TICKETS

WHEREAS, Iowa Code Section 331.553(8) provides that pursuant to an Iowa Code Chapter 28E Agreement the Crawford County Treasurer may collect delinquent parking fines on behalf of the City of Denison in conjunction with renewal of motor vehicle registrations; and

WHEREAS, an Iowa Code Chapter 28 E Cooperative Agreement between the City of Denison and Crawford County has been prepared to provide for the collection of delinquent parking ticket debt on behalf of the City of Denison in conjunction with vehicle registration renewals.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors for Crawford County, Iowa, that the Iowa Code Chapter 28E Cooperative Agreement between Crawford County and the City of Denison, Iowa, on file in the Crawford County Auditor's Office, which Agreement provides for the collection of parking ticket debt on behalf of the city of Denison, Iowa, is hereby

approved and the Chairperson of the Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized and directed to sign the Agreement on behalf of the Crawford County Board of Supervisors and the Crawford County Auditor is directed to attest the signature.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Crawford County Treasurer is directed to coordinate the filing of the 28E Cooperative Agreement with the City of Denison, administer the performance of the 28E Cooperative Agreement, and monitor the process for collection and return of payments provided in the Agreement.

A motion was made by Skoog, seconded by Heiden to approve the 28E Agreement between West Central Community Action and Crawford County.

Resolution Establishing a 28E Agreement with West Central Community Action

WHEREAS, Crawford County and West Central Community Action desire to continue the relationship between the county and the non-profit pursuant to an Iowa Code Chapter 28E agreement;

WHEREAS, Crawford County will provide, along with other counties, funds to West Central Community Action in return for various social services;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CRAWFORD COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS that he Agreement known as the "28E Agreement for Funding for Services between West Central Community Action and the Counties of Cass, Crawford, Fremont, Harrison, Mills, Monona, Montgomery, Page and Shelby, Iowa," a copy of which is attached, is approved.
