RESOLUTION REGARDING THE NECESSITY FOR ECONOMIC EFFORTS AND APPROVING PROMOTION OF SUCH EFFORTS

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF CRAWFORD COUNTY, IOWA, THAT:

- 1. The state of Iowa generally and Crawford County, Iowa, in particular have in the past several years experienced adverse economic effects, including the loss of small businesses and erosion of tax base.
- 2. The economy of Crawford County is not sufficiently diversified to provide a stable economic base but is in large part dependent on agriculture and agribusiness
- 3. The current economic problems in the small business industries have reached sufficiently serious proportions that the general welfare of the citizens of the County is threatened thereby.
- 4. It is therefore in the best interest of the citizens of Crawford County, Iowa to take steps reasonably calculated to lead to diversified economic development in Crawford County, Iowa.
- 5. Crawford County does not have sufficient resources to hire a Director of Economic Development as a County employee and lacks sufficient resources to effectively operate an economic development program on its own.
- 6. Other cities and counties in Iowa are engaging in economic development efforts.
- 7. Therefore, Crawford County, Iowa finds that it is in the best interests of its citizens to cooperate with the cities in Crawford County, Iowa, and the Chamber & Development Council of Crawford County, a non-profit corporation, in order to promote diversified economic development in Crawford County, Iowa.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Crawford County, Iowa, has and will continue to support in efforts to enhance economic development by its financial contribution to Region XII Council Governments, CDC and other efforts as such arise throughout the year.

WHEREAS, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution can submit to the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) an adopted recommendation to approve or disapprove a construction permit application regarding a proposed confinement feeding operation structure; and

WHEREAS, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution and submitted an adopted recommendation may contest the DNR's decision regarding a specific application; and

WHEREAS, by adopting a construction evaluation resolution the board of supervisors agrees to evaluate every construction permit application for a proposed confinement feeding operation structure received by the board of supervisors between February 1, 2023 and January 31, 2024 and submit an adopted recommendation regarding that application to the DNR; and

WHEREAS, the board of supervisors must conduct an evaluation of every construction permit application using the master matrix created in Iowa Code section 459.305, but the board's recommendation to the DNR may be based on the final score on the master matrix or may be based on reasons other than the final score on the master matrix;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF CRAWFORD COUNTY that the Board of Supervisors hereby adopts this construction evaluation resolution pursuant to Iowa Code section 459.304(3).
